Rachel Meeropol – Center for Constitutional Rights Attorney. Expert on mass incarceration, prisoner's rights, Muslim profiling and racial injustice. She was the counsel in the class action suit challenging long-term solitary confinement in California's Pelican Bay Prison.

Devon Carbado – UCLA Professor, teaches constitutional criminal procedure, critical race theory and criminal adjudication. Author of many books and articles, he has been a visiting professor at Harvard and is currently working on a series of articles on race, law and police violence.

Alexandra Natapoff – Loyola Law School Associate Dean and Professor. Her focus is on misdemeanors and their influence on the criminal justice system, and is the subject of her new book. Her work on criminal informants made her a nationally recognized expert.
