**Mike Feuer – City Attorney of Los Angeles**, created the Community Justice Initiative to reduce recidivism and address the root causes of crimes. His office prosecutes all misdemeanor criminal offenses and infractions and is a resource for victims and witnesses of crimes.

**Rachel Meeropol – Center for Constitutional Rights Attorney**. Expert on mass incarceration, prisoner's rights, Muslim profiling and racial injustice. She was the counsel in the class action suit challenging long-term solitary confinement in California's Pelican Bay Prison.

**Devon Carbado – UCLA Professor**, teaches constitutional criminal procedure, critical race theory and criminal adjudication. Author of many books and articles, he has been a visiting professor at Harvard and is currently working on a series of articles on race, law and police violence.

**Alexandra Natapoff – Loyola Law School Associate Dean and Professor**. Her focus is on misdemeanors and their influence on the criminal justice system, and is the subject of her new book. Her work on criminal informants made her a nationally recognized expert.
